

GETTING THE MOST OUT OF FILTERING & LINKING REPORT TABLES **to obtain selected Measurement Lists**

Lets suppose that you wish to see results for only one group of sheep from your total tags list. e.g. Sire XXX, 1999 drop ram progeny and their measurements.

1. Go to Reports, Tags.
 2. Select the Filter
 - choose dates to correspond with the 1999 drop sheep
 - choose rams from the Sex filter
 - choose sire from the Sire filter
 3. Apply the filter and the number of sheep selected will show at the base of the report list. The sheep now listed on the screen are those that you have selected.
SO FAR SO GOOD!!
 4. Now click on the Measurements Tab at the top of the (Report/Browsing Form) screen.
 5. Select the Filter again and filter something! (e.g. date of measurement, range of micron) And click apply.
 6. You will see the number of measurement records appear at the base of the screen.
 7. Now all you have to do now is click on the little white box on the right of the Tags button at the base of the screen, and WAIT.
 8. You should now see (at the base of the screen) that the number of records has changed because it is now taking into account your filter query from the tags filter as well as the instructions from the measurement filter.
 9. When this number of records has changed all you do now is select Print and (say measurement list) and you will get a list of measurements that correspond to the two filter queries.
- The above linking process is the basis of all the linked reporting processes for output of information.
 - If you have not done so previously, try doing the Sire Measurement analysis (found in the Print section of Measurement Reports) or the Sire Last Class Analysis (found in the Print section of the Tags Reports).
